Prof. David Arthur Skeel is the S. Samuel Arsht Professor of Corporate Law at the University of Pennsylvania Law School. He is author of *The New Financial Deal Understanding the Dodd-Frank Act and its (Unintended) Consequences* (Wiley, 2011); *Icarus in the Boardroom: The Fundamental Flaws in Corporate America and Where They Came From* (Oxford, 2005); and *Debt's Dominion: A History of Bankruptcy Law in America* (Princeton, 2001). Abstract:

Throughout history, ideas and ethical systems have come and gone, religions have emerged and faded, and intellectual movements have thrived only to be supplanted. Surveying this legacy, we can't help but ask whether anything is worth believing, and whether any religion or system of thought can possibly be true. Enter a conversation with David Skeel—professor of law and Christian thinker—as he reflects on the features of Christianity that make it unique, and what it tells us about consciousness, beauty, suffering, and justice.
